Now comes the plaintiff, Anna Sherman, and for cause of action against the defendant, Elezior Silver, avers and says that said defendant, together with his agents, did, on or about the 10th day of January, 1941, falsely, maliciously and without probable cause, present to the Prosecuting Attorney of Hamilton County, Ohio, a complaint, charging said plaintiff, together with her husband, Edward Sherman, with an assault with intent to kill said defendant.

Plaintiff further says that because of and owing to said false charge, as aforesaid, said defendant, together with his agents, did falsely and maliciously and without probable cause, procure the indictment of said plaintiff on a charge of Assault with Intent to kill said defendant; that said indictment, as aforesaid, was returned by the Hamilton County Grand Jury in their report of January 17th, 1941, and was spread on the criminal records of Hamilton County, Ohio, as Indictment No. 48230.

Plaintiff further says on the 17th day of January, 1941, as a result of said indictment, as aforesaid, she was arrested by a Deputy of the Hamilton County Sheriff, was taken in custody by said deputy, transported to the Hamilton County Court House, Criminal Division, where, in order to gain her liberty and release while awaiting trial on the criminal charge set forth in said indictment,

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was compelled to furnish bond in the sum of \$1,000.00.

Plaintiff further says that on the 13th day of January 1941, she was arraigned in open Criminal Court on said charge and entered a plea of not guilty.

Plaintiff further says that on the day set for a trial of said charge, to-wit February 14th, 1941, said defendant did falsely, maliciously and without reasonable or probable cause, prosecute and cause to be prosecuted said charge of Assault with Intent to Kill said defendant, against this plaintiff in the Criminal Division of the Common Pleas Court of Hamilton County, Ohio, whereupon, on February 17th, 1941, following a trial of two days, the jury, in said case duly sworn, then and there rendered a verdict of not guilty, thereby discharging said plaintiff of and from the criminal charge, in said indictment contained, and completely ending and determining said criminal proceeding.

Plaintiff further says that at the time said defendant, together with his agents, procured said indictment against said plaintiff, as aforesaid, said charge and arrest of plaintiff was made public and was given wide publicity in the local and foreign newspapers.

Plaintiff further says that by reason of said arrest and indictment, procured falsely, maliciously and without probable or reasonable cause, by said defendant, together with his agents, as aforesaid, she has been compelled to expend the sum of \$500.00 for attorney fees; that she has been injured in her reputation and her business and her standing in society; that by such false, malicious and unreasonable prosecution of this plaintiff by said defendant, together with his agents, she has been greatly humiliated and ridiculed; that her reputation in the community has been damaged and that she has been because thereof subjected to great humiliation and mental pain and suffering; that her nervous system has been shocked; that she has spent sleepless nights, worrying and grieving over her public disgrace caused by the said acts of said defendant

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together with his agents, and that because thereof she has
been damaged in the sum of \$50,500.00.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against the
defendant in the sum of \$50,500.00, together with her costs
herein expended and for all other relief that is just and
proper.

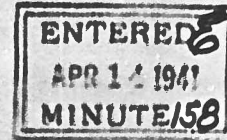

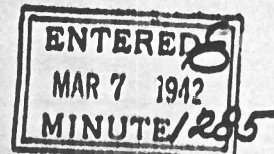

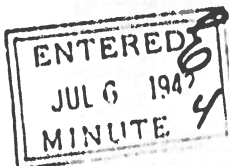
