CHANUKAH MESSAGE By Rabbi Aaron A. Rabenstein

When the saintly Mattathais, the father of the Maccabees, called for the defense of G-D and His Torah, he proclaimed "Mi Lahshem E'ly—Who is for G-D, come with me." This was the same call that Moses used when to his horror he found his people worshipping the the Golden Calf.

As in the time of Moses, Mattathais found the people worshipping golden images, worshipping physical power and earthly pleasures. They were discounting the Ominipotence and Supreme existence of the One and Only G-D.

Once again today we are hearing rumblings of these ancients and infantile beliefs supposedly built on the firm basis of intellectual foundations. But those that hear the call to the true belief in G-D hear the true call from Sinai. The others find that they have built an intellectual tower. Another Tower of Babel which must find its end as the ancient tower years ago in utter confusion. Chanukah calls to us, "Who is to G-D come to Me." Let us bring G-D back into Chanukah.
