MESSAGE FROM MRS. ERNST KAHN SISTERHOOD PRESIDENT

The Pesach holiday always makes me think of the particular attributes which make a slave a free man. Obviously, it isn't only physical enslavement, for our ancestors, the Children of Israel, behaved like slaves even after they were physically freed and had left Egypt.

They were complaining, querulous, disloyal and unhappy. Many of them, we are told, were ready to go back and rather be slaves in the land of Egypt.

You and I have seen this same drama played in contemporary times when a small number of Jews freed from Russia chose rather to go back to slavery — they could not accept or appreciate their freedom.

What is it that a free man has to know? He must recognize that freedom is not the pot of gold at the end of the rainbow. It is not instant happiness. Freedom is *added* responsibility, and added work. The slave has to assume the responsibilities which the master supposedly had. The free man must be his own master.

May we, who are free, gladly and willingly fulfill the responsibilities of freedom and carry the yoke and the burden it thrusts upon us with dignity and with honesty.

SELLING CHOMETZ

PURPOSE: The Torah being concerned about the economic welfare of the Jewish people, has provided for one contingency where, due to the laws of Passover, a loss might result through the destruction of large quantities of Chometz, by allowing us to sell it to a non-Jew. Inasmuch as all dishes used during the year contain Chometz, every household is vitally concerned.

METHOD: By the legal transfer of Chometz property to a non-Jew, we are no longer the owners of it, and, therefore, do not carry any responsibility for it.

The legal intricacies covering such a transfer of property are many and involved, and only an orthodox Rabbi should be entrusted with its execution, in the same manner in which we entrust our secular legal affairs to a trained and bonafide lawyer.

~~The latest time for selling and burning Chometz is Friday, April 5, 12 noon. The home should be completely pesachdig for Shabbos. Egg Matzo may be used Friday evening and Shabbos morning for Hamotzi, however only till 10:50 a.m. Saturday morning, April 6. After the morning meal, Kol Chamiro, usually recited at the burning of Chometz, is recited. Pesach is over Sunday night, April 14 at 9:00 p.m.~~
